Let's play Book Chain

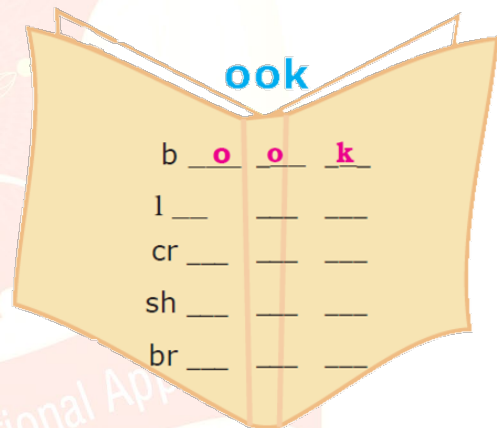
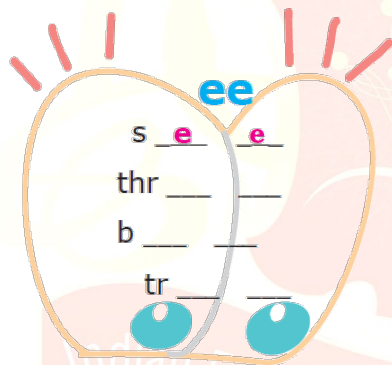
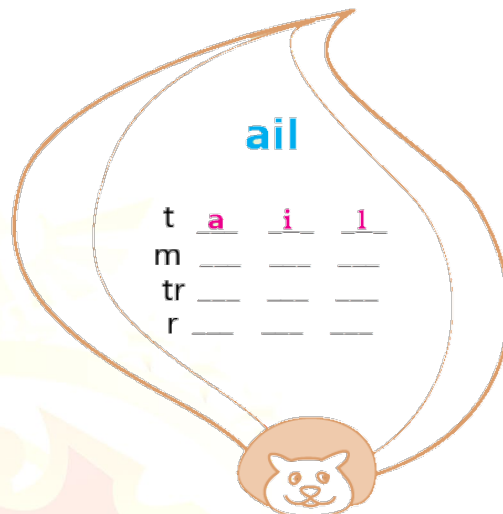
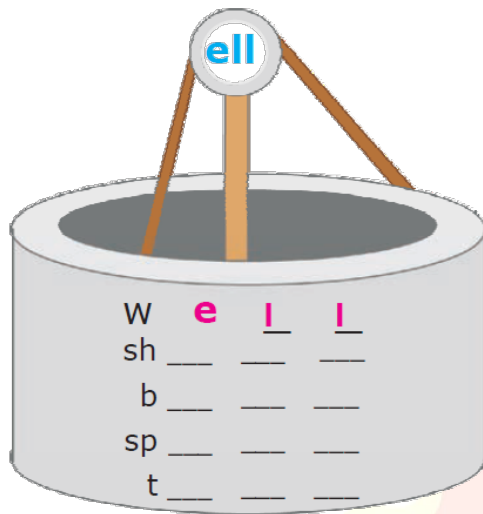

(Note: The student has to attempt on their own.)

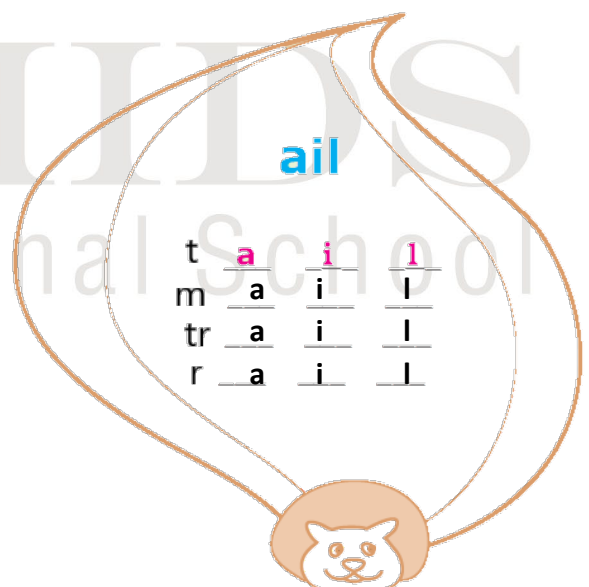
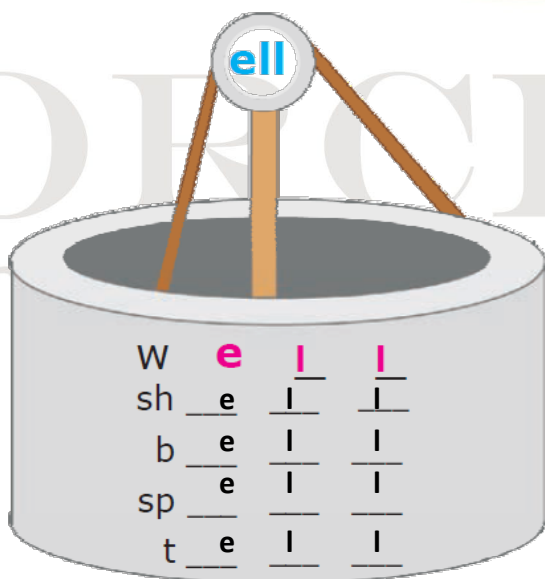
